At the Request of William Bowel of the City of Philadelphia ^{Victuallar} that We would Grant him to take up and inclose one Square of Ground Scituate between Mulberry Street and Sassafras Street and between the Eleventh and Twelfth Streets from ye River Delaware and that He may hold the Same for the Space of one & Twenty Years next ensuing the date hereof for which He agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary or Trustees of the Province. Forty Shillings Sterling Mony of Great Britain Yearly during the said Term and at the expiration there of to Deliver up and Surrender the Same under a good Fence and well improved. These are to Authorize, and Require thee to Survey & layout or cause to be Survey'd and laid out unto the Said William Bowel in the place aforesaid the Said Square of Ground to be by him held under the Yearly rent of Forty Shillings Sterling which in case the said William fulfill & pay then this Survey shall be for the said Term Valid, otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
