Whereas the former Commissioners of Properly by their Warr^t
bearing date the 3d day of the First Month A.D. 1703^{1/4} directed unto David Powel
Surveyor Granted unto Randal Janney deceased five hundred Acres of Land
to be taken up in right and as part of three thousand Acres Granted by the
Proprietor unto John Wilmer who convey'd the same to the said Randal who
by his Indented Deed ~~dated~~ bearing date the 18th day of November A.D. 1708
Granted all the sd three thousand Acres unto John Budd & his Sister Sarah
Morrey both of the City of Philad^{ia} to their Heirs & Assigns forever And
whereas the said Warr^t having been executed together with one other for
the like quantity and of the same tenour by Henry Hollingsworth by vertue
(as it is said) of a verbal order from the said David Powel in such a ma-
nner as the sd John & Sarah are altogether dissatisfied therewith They the
said John & Sarah have requested of us That we would suffer them to resign
~~the~~ to the Proprietor the said Survey & Tract of Land whereon the said
Warrant was executed and that we would in lieu thereof Grant them our
Warr^t for taking up the like quantity Elsewhere and accordingly they
doe resign the same These therefore are to Authorize and Require
thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the sd John Budd & Sarah
Morrey according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said
quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor
appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians And make Return thereof into
the Secretaries Office Given under our hands & Seal of the sd
Province at Philad^{ia} the 16th day of the eleventh Month A.D.
