That We would Grant him a Resurvey on his Plantation and Lands in Passayunk and Miamensen in Shuylkhill Neck by him purchased of Several persons who derived from Grants under ye Govmt of New York. the first reputed to contain One hundred and Seventy Acres of fast Land besides Meadow and one hundred Acres of Marsh or Swamp the other being one fourth part of five hundred and eighty eight Acres of fast Land & Meadow in Miamensen equally divided among the s<sup>d</sup> Andrew, Jn<sup>o</sup> Stille, Andrew Wheeler & ye Widow Naylor. These are to Authorize and Require thee exactly to Resurvey the s<sup>d</sup> Several Tracts of fast Land. Meadow. Marsh and Swamps according to their known Bounds and Ancient Lines of Survey and make Return of ye same together with one hundred Acres of Marsh granted to ye s<sup>d</sup> Andrew <sup>& his son</sup> by ye Prop<sup>rs</sup> into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadia where this Warrt is to remain a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of ye Province at Philadelphia 26<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
