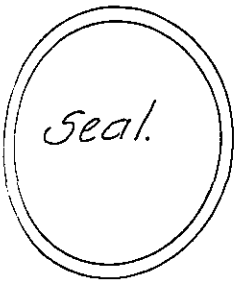

er of five hundred Acres, That I would grant him to take up on
Resurvey his sd. purchase out of the remaining of the two
Tracts of one Thousand- each formerly laid out by Warr^t
from my Comm^{rs} to W^m Hudson, Jn^o Cornwell, Tho. Langhorn
and ye sd Arthur Burdal. These are to require thee forthwith
to Resurvey and lay out or cause to be resurvey'd and laid
out of the Tract aforesaid the said Number of five hundred
Acres to the sd John Burdal- he Seating the Same wth in Nine
Months after ye Date of Survey and make Returns there of
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand & Seal at
Philad^a the 25th day of the first Month 1701.
