At the Request of John Budd, Brewer. That We would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right and as part of five thousand Acres Originally purchased by Jn<sup>o</sup> Tatham (als Grey). These are to require thee forthwith to Survey & lay out to the sd Jn<sup>o</sup> Budd the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province (according to ye Method of Townships appointed) that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns into ye General Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy there of to be delvd to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> day of ye 6<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
