and ye Land of Bretto Justis reputed to contain 100 Acres. Sold to  
the sd Rich<sup>d</sup> Bonsall by Enoch Enochson heir to his father Gar-

8<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>mo</sup> 1709.


