We would Grant him to take up the like Quantity in a Tract of Land formerly laid out to Griffith Jones ~~in~~ In the 5<sup>d</sup> County but by him quitted and now left Vacant, Also that we would Grant him to add thereunto One hundred & fifty Acres now purchased. These are to require thee to Survey and layout to the 5<sup>d</sup> John Bowater. the 5<sup>d</sup> two hundred and fifty Acres together with the 5<sup>d</sup> quantity of one hundred and fifty Acres. compleating in the whole four hundred Acres of Land in the 5<sup>d</sup> Tract next adjoyning or nearest to the ~~the~~ Land by him quitted as afore said, not interfering with the Present Settlement<sup>ts</sup> of the Indians thereupon. And make Returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary.
