These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said William Buffington according to the method of Townships appointed and adjoining to the Surveys already made in the said forks. the said quantity of Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Vacant Land and make Returns into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the said William fulfill the Agreement aforesaid shall be Valid. otherwise the Same shall be void & of no Effect as if ~~it~~ it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the first day of the first Month A.D. 171<sup>3/4</sup>.
