At the Request of John Buffington of the County of Chester. (by Ezekiel Harland) That we would grant him to take up Two hundred and fifty Acres of Vacant Land in the forks of Brandywine in the said County for which he has agreed to pay to the Proprietor's Use on the 29th day of September next five and Twenty pounds and the usual Quittrents of one English shilling for each hundred and so proportionably. These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Surveyed to the said John Buffington according to the Method of Townships appointed and adjoyning to the Surveys in the said forks the said quantity of two hundred and fifty Acres of Vacant Land and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the said John fulfill the Agreement aforesaid shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever granted.
