Whereas John Buckly at his first Arrival in this Province before ye
 Division thereof from the Lower Counties seating himself in the Man-
 nor of Rocklands (since so called) procured ^{from ye Propriet'} a Survey there in of one
 Hundred Acres at ye Yearly Rent of — And further procured from the
 Commiss^{rs} of Property in ye Year 1691 ~~900~~ Thirty Acres to be added thereto
 unto at ye yearly Rent of a penny sterl^l & acre. But finding his Plantation
 much too narrow hath requested us to grant him the Complim^t of what
 he now holdt to two hundred Acres, for which he hath agreed to pay to
 the Propriet^{rs} use twenty pounds on ye 25th of ye first Month next en-
 suing: These therefore are to require thee to Resurvey the sd Parcels
 of one Hundred & Thirty Acres according to their first true Bounds
 of Survey, provided they Injure not ye Mannor. Also to Survey & lay
 out to ye sd John Buckly somuch of the Mannorland adjoyning on
 ye Northwest end of the sd Land as will make up ye same full two
 hundred Acres with Allowance of ten Acres for ye hundred first
 taken up if found therein, but not otherwise, provided Alwayest that
 the quantity of the sd Complim^t may be conveniently laid out with-
 out injuring ye Mannor & that ye sd place be not called or chosen. And
 make Returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philad^{ia} where
 this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee cer-
 tified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands & Seal of ye Pro-
