



By Virtue of a Warrant from ye Prop<sup>s</sup> Comm<sup>s</sup> dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of ye 9<sup>th</sup> mo. 1714 survey<sup>d</sup> to Arthur Barrett a Certain Tract of Land <sup>situate North</sup> of Nottingham ye Chester County.

Begining at a Chesnut Tree being a Corner of ye Land of Rich<sup>d</sup> Grafton, thence North West by Vacant Land Sixty perches to a post. thence South West Sixty perches to a post. thence North West one Hundred perches to a post. thence North East three Hundred & forty perches to a post. thence South East One Hundred & Sixty perches to a Hickery. thence South West by ye Land of the sd Rich<sup>d</sup> Grafton two Hundred & Eighty perches to ye place of Begining Containing three Hundred Acres with ye allowance of Six P<sup>er</sup> Cent.

Survey<sup>d</sup> & Lay<sup>d</sup> out by ye Gen<sup>l</sup> Surv<sup>rs</sup> Ord<sup>r</sup> ye 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1716.
