At the Request of William Beals of Nottingham that We would Grant him to take up three Hundred Acres of Land inⁱⁿ the County of Chester which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Thirty Pounds for the whole and the Usual Yearly Quitrents of one Shilling Sterling for every Hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said William Beals in ~~the~~ ^{County} the ~~Place~~ aforesaid, According to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne there of into the Secretary's office. Which Survey in case the Said William Beales fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of the Ninth Month Anno Din. 1714.
