By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of John Bown of the County of Chester. that We would Grant him to take up one hundred and fifty Acres of Land in Goshen near Isaac Malins for which He agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees Four and Twenty pounds Mony of Pensilvania one half to be paid at the Fair in the next ^{Third} Month at Philadelphia and the remainder in six Months next after with Interest and ye yearly quit rent of one shilling & Six pence Sterling for the same. These are to Authorize & require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Bown at the place aforesd according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of one hundred & fifty Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated & make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office. which Survey in case the said John Bown fulfill the above agreement shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ^{ever} granted.
