

By virtue of a Warrant—the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of March Anno Domini 1713<sup>3/4</sup>. Surveyd and Laid out the first Day of April 1714 unto Joseph Buckley son of Joseph Buckley late of London deceased. Nine hundred Acres of Land (Purchased of the Proprietor by the said Joseph Buckley the Elder in the Year 169-) Situate in the Township of Caln in the County of Chester. Beginning at a Corner Marked White Oak a Corner of George Claypoole's Land and Extending by the same and other land south three hundred and forty three pches to <sup>a</sup> Corner Post. Thence by a Line of Marked trees West four hundr<sup>d</sup> forty five perches to a Corner post. Thence North by a Line of Marked trees three hundred forty three perches to a Spanish Oak. Then East by a Line of Mark<sup>t</sup> trees four hundred forty five pches to the place of Beginning. Containing Nine hundred acres with an Addition or Allowance of Six acres & Cent.
