These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and layout or cause to be Survey'd and laid out unto the said John Batten the said one Hundred and fifty Acres of Land in the said County and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in order to a further Confirmation which Survey in case the said John Batten fulfill the <sup>within three Months after Location</sup> above agreement, shall be Valid other wise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this Warrant ever granted.
