At the Request of Peter Baydeller late of Germany but now of
this Province, that We would Grant him to take up Two Hundred
Acres of Land near ye Plantation whereon Peter Bizailon former-
ly dwelt on the West side of Schuylkill—for which he agrees
to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees Six & Thirty pounds
Money of Pensilv^a for ye whole and ye Yearly quitrent of one Shilling
Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee
to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto ye said Peter Baydeller at the place
aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said
quantity of two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already
Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make
Returns there of into ye Secretarys Office, which Survey in case
the Said Peter fulfill the above agreement within three Months
after the date here of shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be
Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.

the 9th day of December Anno D^r 1719.
