




William Penn, Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Pennsylvania, & ye Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye Request of Richard Wall in behalf of W<sup>m</sup> Brown M<sup>ch</sup>t. Purchaser of One Thousand Acres. y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up his Proportion of Land w<sup>th</sup> in ye Liberties of ye City. These are to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him Twenty Acres of Land w<sup>th</sup> in ye Bounds thereof where not taken up, according to ye method of Townships appointed by me & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia ye 2<sup>d</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> mo 1683.
