These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Richard Beason according to the Method of Townships appointed within the Said County, the Said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor approplated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return there of into the Secretary's wet Survey in case the Said Richard fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date here of Shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands& Seals of the Province at Philade the 12 day of ye 10 !! month Anno Din. 1716.
