At the Request of Richard Beason of Nottingham that We would Grant him to take up in Chester County five hundred Acres of Land for which He agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use Fifty Pounds Mony of Pensilvania for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Richard Beason according to the Method of Townships appointed within the Said County, the Said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return there of into the Secretary's ^{Office} w^{ch} Survey in case the Said Richard fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & Seals of the Province at Philad^a the 12th day of ye 10th month Anno Din. 1716.
