By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of John Batten of the County of Chester. that we would Grant him to take up amongst the new Surveys made in the said County the quantity of three hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietor's use thirty Pounds Money of this Province for the whole and the Yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Batten in the said County. according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians. and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> Month Anno Dom. 1717.
