trees N.E. 280 perch to a marked white oak from thence by a line of  
marked trees E.N.E. 120 perch to a marked poste and from thence  
N.N.W. 160 ~~perch~~ to a marked white oak from thence W.S.W. 456 perch  
to a marked white oak standing by Chester Creek and down the s<sup>d</sup>  
creek on severall Coarses to the first menchened ~~white~~<sup>ash</sup> tree.
