

By Vertue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 12th of the 8^m 1703 for Surveying unto John Budd of Philadelphia Brewer five hundred acres of land in this Province being the remainder and full Compliment of the Original purchase made by Jn^o Gray alias Tatham Esq^r of five thousand acres of which the said John purchased one Moiety.

Survey'd the 25th of December 1703 unto the s^d John Budd the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in the County of Chester. Beginning at a Corner black oak standing in ye line of Loetitia Penns Manor. Thence South four hundred forty three perches and a half by the said line of the Manor to a Corner black oak being a Corner of Judge Guests land. Thence East three hundred twenty four per. to a Hickery tree. Then North an hundred twenty three and a half perches to a post. Then west one hundred ninety nine perches to a Corner white oak. Then North three hundred and twenty perches by the land of Rawlings &c. to a black oak. Then west one hundred twenty five perches to the place of Beginning.
