(I presume ye Govern^r. intends continui^(obl.) next above ye Last warrant on ye side of ye Creek) I therefor hereby empower thee to survey & sett out ye sd two hundred^(obl.) according to ye way & method agreed on for townships & to return unto me a true duplicate of ye originall field work & protracted figure w^{ch} by my pattent are to remain upon record in my office.
