Then surveyed for Henry Barnard 500 acres of Land lieng on the east side of Brandiewine Creek begining at a marked poste being a corner mark of Edward Bayleys Land and runing along the 5^d Bayleys Line of marked trees 300 pertsch W. N. W. to a marked white oak standing by Brandiewine Creek from thence up the 5^d Creek on generall courses to a marked ash tree being a corner mark of Peter Dicks Land and then runing along the 5^d Dicks line of marked trees 5 E. N. E. 190 pertsch to a marked hickrey tree then runing 5 S. E. 248 pertsch to a marked red oak then runing W. S. W. 137 pertsch to a marked white oak and from thence runing 5 S. E. 234 pertsch to the first menched poste
