



Proportional to this 784 acres there belong
112 acres in the Town Park.

By virtue of a Warrant under the hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governour bearing date the 10 day of the 11th month in the year of our Lord 1706. There was Resurveyed unto Phineas Pemberton a Tract of Land in Wrightstown in the County of Bucks containing Seven hundred and eighty four acres laid out to his Father James Harrison in a Tract of one thousand acres in Right of his Purchase of five thousand acres. Beginning at a Corner marked White oak near Randal's Creek's mouth Thence running by James Radcliff's land North 70 deys easterly 428 perches to a Corner marked Black oak in the line of the Town Park then by the same North West 224 pches to Corner marked Chesnut tree Thence South 83 deys west by Randal Blackshaw's land 456 perches to a Spanish Oak by the main branch of Weshamineh Creek Then Crossing the same to a hickery tree on the other side of the Branch Thence South west 78 pches to a Hickery tree Thence South east 152 pches to a forked white Hickery at the smaller Branch of Weshamineh Creek Then down the ^{same} North 55th easterly 22 perches to the main Branch Thence down the said Shamineh Creek 180 perches to the mouth of Randal's Creek Thence up the same 30 perches to the place of Beginning.

This with one hundred and Twelve acres in the Square or Town Park makes Eight hundred ninety six acres.
