By vertue of a Warr dated this day, from the Propriet and Govern and directed to me, to survey or cause to be surveyed unto James Paxon one hundred acres, unto William Paxon one hundred acres, unto Peter Tremain one hundred acres, unto Jn<sup>o</sup>. Flackney one hundred acres, unto Thomas Marle and Sarah phillipps one hundred acres, and all as head Lands, on the back of the purchasers, and according to the regulation of Townships, I therefore hereby authorize thee to survey and set out unto them accordingly the said respective quantities in a reasonable long square of about a mile long, and begin as low to the Southward as may be, that is where there is room to the back of the purchasers, that so more head lands may be annexed, or otherwise as the method of Townships may direct, And returne me a true duplicate of the originall field work, and protracted figures, which by my pattent are to remain on Record in my office, dated this 24<sup>th</sup> of 11 mo. 1682.
