



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>rs</sup> to me directed dated the 6<sup>th</sup> /<sup>mo</sup> 1702 Surveyed and Layd out unto Randall Speakman Administrator of the estate of Daniel Smyth deceased A Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in Bucks County, Beginning at a small white oak by the River Delaware, Thence by vacant Land West six hundred perches to Post at a corner of his other Land, Then by the same North one hundred thirty eight perches to a black oak at George Pownall's Corner, Then by the said Pownall's Line East <sup>hundred</sup> five, sixty three perches to a dead black oak by the 5<sup>d</sup> River, Then down the several Courses thereof to the place of beginning, Containing five hundred Acres, Layd out the second day of the fifth month 1703
