By virtue of a Warrant from Jacob Taylor to me directed bearing date the 28<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1709 Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners dated the same day: Surveyed & laid out unto William Smith of Wrightstown a Tract of Land at Windy-bush-hill neare the Mannor of Highlands in the 5<sup>d</sup> County of Bucks. Beginning at a White Oak 40 perches North East from Edward West's Corner, ffrom thence runing South East by the 5<sup>d</sup> Mannor two hundred & ffourty perches to a Post, Then South West, by vacant Land one hundred thirty four perches to a small white oak, Then North West by vacant Land two hundred & ffourty perches to a Post, Then by the 5<sup>d</sup> Edward West's land & vacant North East one hundred thirty four perches to the begining Containing two hundred & one acres Laid out the seventh day of the third month 1709
