



By virtue of two Warrants from Jacob Taylor Survey: Gen^l to me directed bearing date the 18th day of June Anno: Day: 1714 Surveyed & Laid out unto Thomas Stevenson in right of George White & Isaac Decow a tract of Land in Plumstead township in Bucks County Beginning at a Post at the Corner of the Land laid out to Elizabeth Sands for the use of the Heires of her first Husband Thomas Norcross, ffrom thence runing by the s^d Land North West ffive hundred & thirty perches to a Post, Then North East by vacant Land one hundred & sixty perches to another Post, Then by vacant Land South East ffive hundred & thirty perches to a stump of a dead tree, Then South West by Land laid out to Widow Musgrove one hundred & sixty perches to the place of begining Containing ffive hundred acres with allowance for Roads according Law; Given under my hand the third day of August Anno Domini 1714.
