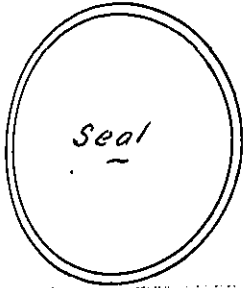

At the Request of Thomas Stevenson That we would Grant him to Take up Two Hundred and fifty acres of Land in Right of George White late of the County of Bucks Deceased Original Purchaser of two Thousand five hundred acres of Land to be taken up in this Province and Given by his last will & Testam^t to his son William White who sold the same to the said Thomas Stevenson -

These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas Stevenson the Quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of Land in the this Province according to the Method of Townships appointed that is not already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in order to a further Confirmation Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 26th day of the third Month Anno Dni 1714
