

These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the 5<sup>d</sup> Randal for the uses aforesaid the said number of five hundred Acres of Land in the County of Bucks that has not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians according to the Method of Townships appointed, and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv'd to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 1<sup>st</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
