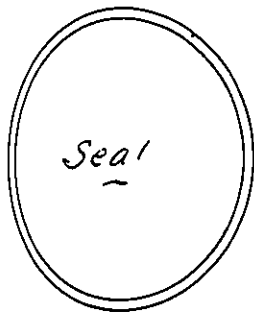

*At the Request of Joseph Thatcher and his Brother Bartholo-
mew Executors of the will of Richard Thatcher Old purchaser of one
thousand acres That I would grant him to take up three hundred and
fifty acres of Land being the remainder (in full of the 5^d Purchase) not
yet taken up These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be
survey'd unto them the 5^d number of 350 acres of Land in this Province not
yet survey'd, taken up, concealed nor settled by the Indians, to be laid out
according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, and make Returns
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and seal at
Philad^{ia} ye first day of ye 12th moth 170⁹*
