



Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General dated the 20th day of the 5th month 1700 surveyed unto Richard Tucker one Tract of Land Lying in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a post the cor^r of William Coopers Land Then north west one hundred eighty four perches and a half by Philips & Worrals Lands to a white oak & a post neare the same Then by Willm Gibsons Land south west four hundred thirty four perches to a heape of stones Then south east by Land left for a road one hundred eighty four perches and a half to a heap of Stones then by the afore-said Willm Coopers Land north east four hundred thirty four perches to the place of Beginning Containeing five hundred ^{& 73 perches} acres of Land Surveyed and certified under my hand the 8th day of the 3rd month 1701 P.
