By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners to me directed to execute all warrant directed to Phineas Pemberton bearing date the 10th day of the 1st month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$, And pursuant to a Warrant from the said Com^{rs} to Phineas Pemberton dated the 21st of the 11th month 1701, Resurveyed the 18th day of the 1st month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$ a Tract of land late in the Possession of John Tatham lying in Bensalem Township in the County of Bucks, Containeing 1012 Acres, Beginning at a corner marked black oak at the mouth of Samuel Allen's Creek, Thence up the said Creek N.W. 46 perches to a white oak, Then by the said Samuel Allen and Joseph Growdon's great Tract North 556 perches to a white oak, Then E.N.E. 360 perches to a Birch tree by Neshameneh Creek, Then down the severall courses thereof to the place of beginning.
