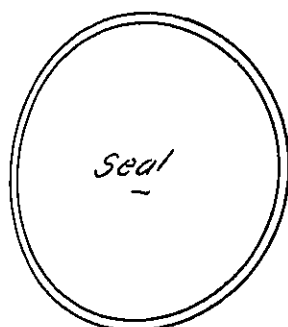

By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Shadrach Wally William Buckman and John Frost of New Town in ye County of Bucks on behalf of themselves & the other Inhabitants of ye said Township that we would grant them for ye conveniency of Roads Passages to ye Water & other Benefits to the said Township. The vacant strip of Land lying on a branch of Meshamena Creek that extends into ye Townsted supposed to contain about thirty acres, for which they agree to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use Ten pounds Money of this Province and in like proportion should it contain more. These are to authorize & Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto ye s<sup>d</sup> Shadrach Wally William Buckman & John Frost, and so many of ye inhabitants of ye s<sup>d</sup> Township as shall within one month after ye date hereof come in & pay their sever<sup>al</sup> shares or proportions of ye purchase & other charges arising on ye same, The said strip of Land reputed to contain about thirty acres, & to divide off to every person holding Land in ye said Townsted so much of the said strip as fronts his Land respectively, all which is to lye & continue for ye publick use and behoof of ye said Shadrach Wally William Buckman John Frost and others of ye said Township that will associate themselves as afore said, and make a Return thereof into ye Secretarys office, which survey in case ye above mentioned persons or some of them fulfill the above agreement within one month after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise ye same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and seal of ye Province at Philadelphia ye 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month Anno Dni 1716
