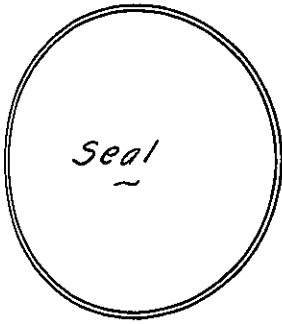

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief  
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed

At the Request of William Waite That I would grant him a  
Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land in the County of Bucks in Southampton  
Township adjoining on the Lands of Tho: Hardin, Joseph Paul and John -  
Parsons formerly laid out to him for one hundred acres in Right of Edw<sup>d</sup>  
Jeffersons Purchase of 1500 acres: These are to require thee forthwith to  
Resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd ~~unto him~~ ~~the~~ ~~said~~ ~~Tract~~ of  
Land according to its ~~the~~ Boundaries and first Lines of Survey and make  
Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and seal  
at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of ye 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700
