

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of Province bearing date the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1702 Granting unto Enoch Yardly a Resurvey on a Tract of land situate in Makefield Township in the County of Bucks laid out to his father William Yardley for five hundred acres in Right of his Original purchase of the said quantity

There is Resurvey'd unto Enoch Yardley a Tract of land in Makefield Township in the County of Bucks laid out to his father Will<sup>m</sup> Yardley for five hundred acres beginning at an elm tree by Delaware River at the corner of Joseph <sup>Clows</sup> ~~Gradows~~ Land from thence by the said land west two degrees southerly eight hundred fifty six perches to a black oak sapling from thence by vacant land north two degrees easterly one hundred and four perches to a post by a Chestnut tree from thence by Reuben Pownells Land east one degree north seven hundred sixty eight perches to a white oak by a Meadow from thence south twenty five degrees easterly twelve perches & a half to a post from thence north seventy four degrees easterly forty seven perches to a small hickory tree by the said River Delaware Then down the several Courses of the said River ninety seven perches to the place of beginning Containing five hundred & eighteen ares Resurvey'd by Jn<sup>o</sup> Cutler the 23<sup>d</sup> of the 9<sup>th</sup> —
