to me directed beareing date the 8th day of the 7th mo. 1704. to lay out
unto Martin Zeale 100 acres of Land in the Mannor of Pensbury at
the yearely Rent of three pence p^r acre Pensylvania money, Laid out unto
the s^d Martin the said quantity Beginning at a white oak in the side of a
swamp being William Biles's Corner, Thence by the s^d Biles's line North thirty
deg^s East forty eight perches to a black oak sapling Then North East one
hundred thirty five perches to a Post, Then by the s^d Mannor South East
one hundred thirty five perches to a forked maple by a Run of water, Then
by s^d Run to another small Run, Then by the small Run to a Gum tree at
the end of a swamp, Then up the s^d swamp North seventy six deg^s West
seventy five perches to a Gum tree, Then South eighty one deg^s West
fifty five perches to the place of beginning Containeing one hundred acres
Laid out the 12th day of the 2^d month 1705 By John Cutler
