

I do hereby Certifie That pursuant to a warrant under the hand and seal of Edward Penington Surveyor General to Phineas Pemberton<sup>for</sup> directed bearing date the 22<sup>d</sup> day of the first month 170<sup>o</sup> by vertue of the Proprietaries warrant to the said Edward Penington dated the same day The said Phineas Pemberton hath made Return into the General Survey office of the Resurvey of a parcel of Land Resurvey'd to Isabel Cutler the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1701 which being Examined and Revised in the said office as follows viz:

The said land Scituate <sup>in Southampton</sup> in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Corner marked black oak a the Corner of Joseph Growden's land from thence extending Northwest one hundred<sup>o</sup> thirty perches to a Corner post from thence South west by John Naylor's land four hundred perches to a post thence south east one hundred and thirty perches to a post thence north east by Joseph Growden's land four hundred perches to the place of beginning Containing three hundred and twenty five acres.
