 These are to require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the said  
~~John~~ James Cooper the said number of three hundred acres of Land  
 in the Township allotted for Servants where not already survey'd  
 to, nor taken up by any other and make Returns thereof into the  
 general Surveyors Office at Philadelphia, where this Warrant is  
 to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivd to thee certified by ye Secre-  
 tary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office.
