Whereas the Proprietor by good sufficient Deeds in ye
 Year 1681 granted unto J^{no} Penington (among others of
 that family) twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land to be taken up in
 this Province in right of w^{ch} there was a certain Tract in ye County of Bucks
 sett apart and laid out in the name of the said John and his Brother
 Dan^l Wharley in w^{ch} Tract by a prior survey as it appears there was before
 laid out a certain parcel of Land containing about — acres being
 the Remainder of Dove Wiggans & Samway their Original Purchase of
 fifteen hundred Acres Now these are at the Request of the Attorney
 of John Clark Assignee of the s^d John Penington to Authorise and
 Require thee forthwith to cause the Remaind^r due upon ye afores^d Pur-
 chases of Dove Wiggans & Samway to be laid out in the afores^d Tract
 in ye County of Bucks, and to divide the Remaind^r equally of the s^d Tract
 equally between the s^d J^{no} Clark & Dan^l Wharley or his assigns And further
 to lay out the Complem^t of the s^d Johns whole Purchase that shall re-
 main after the s^d Survey in such other vacant Land in this Province (ac-
 cording to ye method of Townships appointed) as has not been Surveyed
 nor taken up And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office
 Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the
 21st day of the first month 1709
