


## The Bounds of Hannah Carpenter's Land at Bristol, Vizt

Beginning at a forked Black Oak, on the Bank of Delaware River at a Corner of Wm Atkinson's Land and Extending from thence down the said River on the Several Courses of the same 254 perches to a Corner of Anthony Burton's Then North 20 degrees West 44 perches Then South 70 degrees West 55 perches to a Corner of the <sup>land</sup> Late of John White deceased Then by the same North by East one hundred and sixty perches to a corner Black Oak Then West by North by the said White's land nineteen perches and a half to a Corner stone Then by the same Land South by West 106 perches to a Corner of Geo Clough's Land Then by the said Clough's line South 59 degrees West forty one perches to a Great Corner Stone Then South thirty three degrees East by the same Land twenty perches Then South three Degrees West Three perches to a post at John Large's Corner Then by the said Large's land South 52 degrees West Eight perches to Market Street Then Crossing the said Street on the Course last mentioned three perches to a Corner of Henry Tomlinson's Lot of Land Then by the same South 66 degrees West eight perches and ten foot to a Black Oak Sapping Then South fifty degrees West by the said Tomlinson's land six perches and six foot to Mill Street Then North West by Mill Street Extended seven perches to a Corner of John Hall's lot Then by same North twenty three degrees East 3 perches and a half Then North forty seven degrees East by the said Hall's Lot eight perches Then North 43 degrees West by the same forty five foot to a corner ~~of~~
