

The piece of Land in Bristol in the County of Bucks to be Confirmed to Jos. Bond by H. Carpenter

Begins at a Corner made by the Intersection of Mill Street and Pond Street Thence by the said Pond South West seven perches and and a half. Then by <sup>2</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Short Street leading down to Mill Creek South ten degrs East eight perches Then by said Creek South Eighty six degrees West thirteen perches and a half <sup>Again</sup> ~~Then~~ by the said Creek about South West thirty four perches. Then by a line North ten degrees West about twenty perches to a Corner Then North thirty three degrees East thirty four perches. Then North seven degrees ~~perches~~ East ten perches Then East four degrees South Six perches and a half to the said Mill Street Then by the same South East ~~twenty eight perches to the place of Beginning~~ seventeen perches and a half to a Corner of John Halls Lot. Then by the same South thirty seven degrees West Four perches and two foot Then South eleven degrees East twenty eight foot and a half to a Thorn tree at a Corner of the said John Halls Lot. Then North East five perches to the said Mill Street. Then South East by the same eight perches and one third part of a perche to the place of Beginning. Contain <sup>2</sup>/<sub>2</sub> six acres and three fourth parts of an Acre.

Also one Lot or piece of Ground beginning at another Cor<sup>r</sup> made by the Intersection of the said Mill Street and Pond Street. Thence running South East by the said Mill Street about seventy eight foot. Then by John Halls lot South forty nine Degrees west nine perches. Then North ten degrees West five perches to the said Pond Street. Then by the same North East ninety four foot to the place of Beginning.

One Acre to be Convey'd by Joseph Bond to W<sup>m</sup> Fishbourn for the use of the Mill. Begin on the North side of Mill Creek about four <sup>perches</sup> above the Mill and running up the said Creek ~~South Eighty Six degrees~~ about ~~five~~ fourteen perches on the Courses thereof to a Corner. Thence North West twelve perches. Thence North East twelve perches. Then South East Sixteen perches to the place of Beginning.
