The Courses of the Creek in Phineas Pemberton's Tract, first down the small Branch N. 55 E. 22 per. Then down the Main Branch S. 17 E. 52, Then S. 47 E. 58 per. Then S. 57 E. 70 perches

Resurveyed the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1701. by Virtue of A Warrant from the Governour dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1700 unto Phineas Pemberton Seven hundred and Eighty four Acres in Wrights Towne in the County of Bucks, Beginning at <sup>a</sup> Corner marked White Oake near Randal's Creek Mouth, Thence by James Radcliffe land E. 20 deg. N. 428 perches to a Corner marked black oak at the Town Park, Then by the same N. W. 224 perches to a Corner marked Chessnutt, Then W. 7 deg. S. by Randal Blackshaw's land 456 perches to a Corner marked Spanish Oake at the maine branch of Neshameny, Then from a Corner marked Hickery beyond the branch 78 perches S. W. to a Corner marked Hickery, Then S. E. 152 perches to a forked White Hickery of the Small branch, Then down the same to the maine branch, Then down the several Courses thereof to Randal's Creek mouth, Then up the said Creek 30 perches to the place of beginning Certified under my hand
