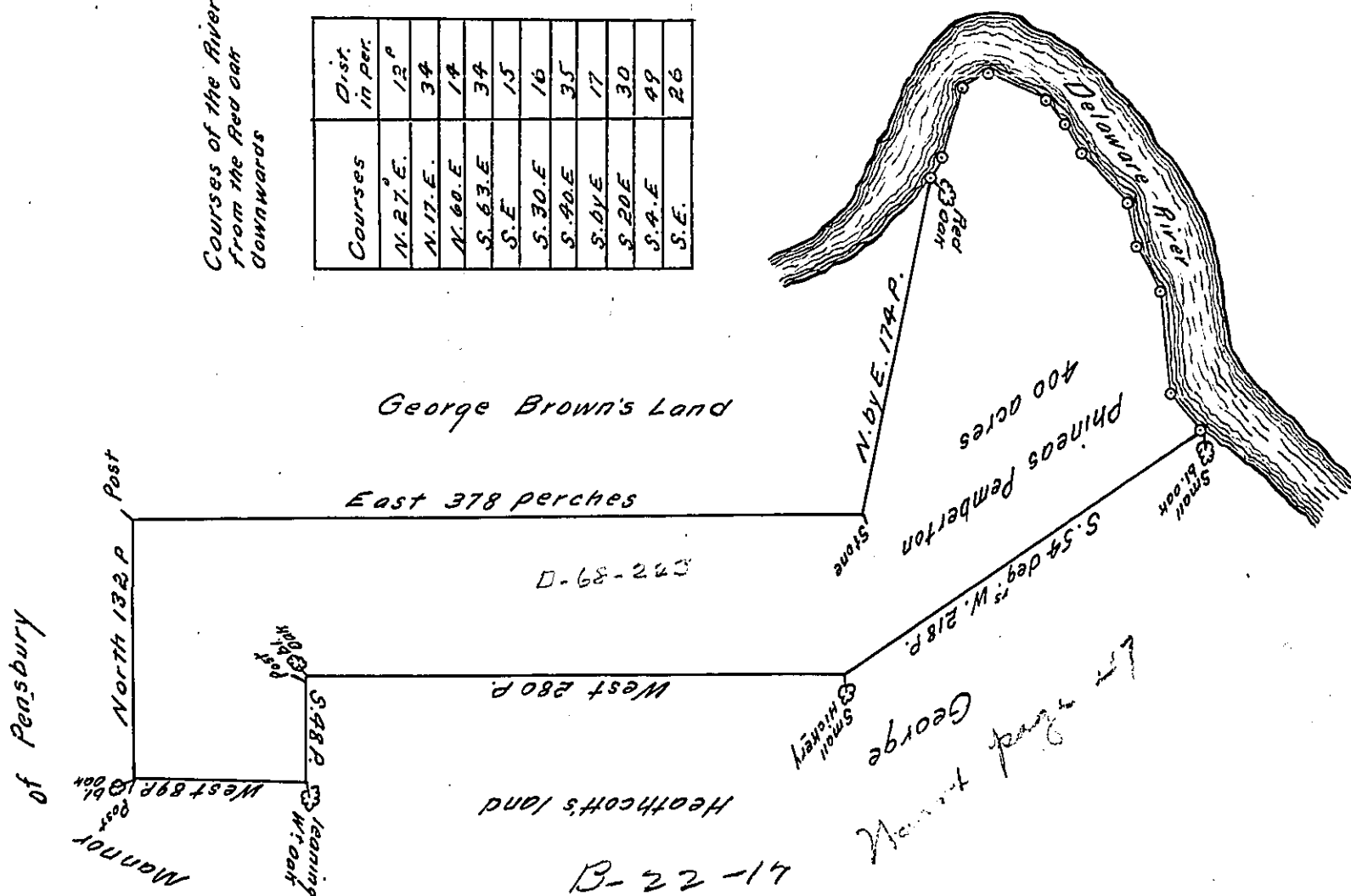

By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Com^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 10th ^{11th} ~~1700~~ 170^{1/2} to execute all Warr^{ts} directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed, And pursuant to a Warr^t from Edward Penington Survey^r Gen^l to the said Phineas Pemberton dated the 13th ^{11th} ~~1700~~ 170^{1/2} to Resurvey unto himself a certaine tract of Land in Falls township in the County of Bucks laid out to him and his ffather in Law James Harrison for 300 acres Resurveyed the said Tract Beginning at a small black oak by the River Delaware at George Heathcott's Corner, Thence by the said Heathcott's line S. 54 deg^s W. 218 perches to a small Hickery, Then West 280 per. to a Post by a black oak, Then South 48 per. to a leaning white oak by the Meadow, Then West by the Manor of Pensbury 89 per. to a Post by a black oak, Then North 132 p. to a Post in George Brown's line Then by the s^d Brown's land East 378 per. to a stone, Then N. by E. 174 per. to a Red oak by the s^d River, Then down the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing 400 acres Resurveyed the 15th ^{11th} ~~1700~~ 1702
