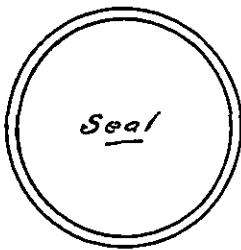

Whereas there is a certain parcel of Land reputed to contain four hundred Acres part of five hundred Acres laid out to Gilbert Wheeler in right of Thomas Rowland purchaser within my Mannor of Highlands on which Sn^r Pidcock in whose possession it now is has requested a Resurvey: These therefore are to require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the 5^d Tract of four hundred Acres according to the first bounds and Lines of Survey, and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office.
