& delivered to thee sometime since might be layd out as soon as possible,  
& as convenient as may be: And upon request of Jn<sup>o</sup> Flackney & Tho. Marel &  
Sarah Philips y<sup>t</sup> at y<sup>t</sup> & in ye same place their head land might be sett  
out also; These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to  
be surveyd for James Packson one hundred Acres, William Packson one  
hundred, Peter Tremain one hundred, John Flackney one hundred Acres,  
& Thomas Marel & Sarah Philips one hundred Acres, having due regard to ye  
Purchasers, & ye Method of Townships agreed on; & this shall be thy Warrant.  
Given at Philadelphia ye 24<sup>th</sup> of ye 11<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1682
