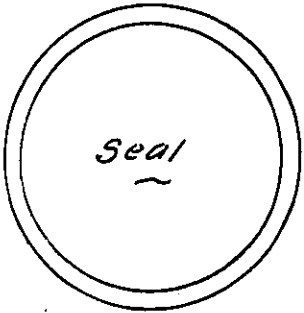

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> in  
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of Phineas Pemberton That I would grant him a  
Resurvey on a Tract of Land situate in Wrights Town in the County of Bucks  
adjoyning on the Land of Randal Blackshaw and Neshaminc<sup>h</sup> Creek reputed  
to contain 800 Acres laid out to his father James Harrison in a Tract of  
1000 Acres in right of his purchase of 5000 Acres. These are to require thee  
forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd ~~and~~ the 5<sup>d</sup> Tract of 800  
Acres according to its ~~the~~ Boundaries and first lines of Survey and make  
exact Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand  
and Seal at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700
