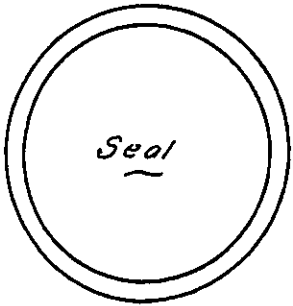


Pensylvania

These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to survey and lay out for the use of the sd Francis Plumsted in the first Township that shall be laid out according to the Method of ~~Townships~~ appointed the said quantity of five hundred Acres over and above what is already granted. And make Returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
