By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries, Comm^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 10th. ^{5th}/_{mo.} 1702 to Resurvey all the lands in falls and Bristol Townships, Resurveyed unto Henry Marjorum a Tract of Land in falls township formerly laid out to John Luff. Beginning at a black oak by the River Delaware at Joseph Chorhey's Corner; Thence by the sd. Chorhey's land W. S. W. 150 p. to a small white oak, Then W. N. W. 206 p. to a black, Then by the Mannor Lands. N. 30 degrs. E. 56 p. to a black oak at Jonathan Taylors Corner; Then by the sd. Taylor's line E. S. E. 184 p. to a white oak. Then E. N. E. 114. perches to the sd. River. Then down the several Courses of the same to the place of beginning. Containing 106. acres. Resurveyed the 14th. ^{10th}/_{mo.} 1702.
